'Would you consider a first look before the ceremony?' with Emily




We have some great inspirational shoots and so much that we look forward to sharing with you.

Elle: Alterations take up alot of my spare time. and I love theatre and am performing in Chitty Chitty Bang Bang as Truly Scrumptious, singing, acting and dancing at the Blind Phoenix Theatre in 2024.

I studied Fashion and Business Management at University specialising in bridal and costume. I have previously worked in luxury retail management for The White Company then lock down made me reevaulate and do what I really wanted to do which was work in bridal.

What star sign are you?

Pisces - very creative, a bit romantic and have lots of love to give.

What do you love most about having your own business?

It's so rewarding to help a bride find their dream dress and be part of their day. I pride myself on customer satisfaction and adapt the business to suit the customer.

When and why did you decide to join the Bridal Reloved Family?

After lockdown, opened 2022. I wanted to be part of something, branch out on my own but with support from a wider network.


What's the inspiration behind you going into the wedding industry?

I have always loved weddings, as a child seeing the little Mermaid in the cinema in 1991, Ariel in her wedding dress was just magical. I am passionate about sustainabilinty and working in this side of the industry by keeping single use items in circulation is really important to me.

Take us on your journey (tell us about how you found the shop building, your first styled shoot and launch event)

I looked at some shops on the main street but they didn't have the privacy I was looking for . I had always dreamed of being in Sanderson Arcade so when I found the studio I did a little happy dance. My first styled shoot was at High House Barn and we had the models in wheat fields and in their beautiful outdoor ceremony space. I met some of my closest supplier friends on the shoot actually. The launch event back in May 2022 was with family , friends and local buinssesses and was a lovely celebrated our first birthday too which was a lovely.







Why should brides visit Bridal Reloved Morpeth?

Brides should visit us as they will be welcomed into a comfortable, private studio filled with designer gowns. I am so passionate about the dresses and the brides that each bride recieves the best service tailored to them and their bridal style.

Who is your ideal bride?

I don't know that I have an ideal bride. Each bride is so individual and that is what I enjoy most . I love seeing each brides unique style amd vision for their bridal look. I love altering dresses to make them perfect for brides. An open mind and being ready to say yes are important factors to dress shopping but every bride is my ideal.

What budget should you set for your wedding dress?

The budget you set is so individual. If you have a specific budget in mind and are corncerned about overspending, you can advise me in advance and I can curate a rail within your budget or remove any dresses that are not suitable so that you know what you are looking at and trying is affordable to you.

Where would be your dream styled shoot to be part of?



Oh my goodness.... my absolute dream shoot would be in the Norwegian fjords with crystal clear reflections and crisp white colours. Or amongst the giant Canadian redwoods for an earthy styled shoot.... definitely somewhere within nature. Closer to home, i'd love to shoot at the coast with a bride emerging from the sea like a bridal siren.

What options do you offer brides in the shop? (2 hour appointment / disabled access / refreshments etc?)

We offer a 2hr exclusive appointment as we have a one bride at a time policy. We have disabled access via a lift accessed through Austin House and a ramp for the last few steps. Please advise in advance if you require this so I can be ready to welcome you . Our studio and fitting room are spacious also. You will be offered complimentary refreshments at the start of your appointment and a celebratory drink when you say yes to saving a dress.

Where can we find Bridal Reloved Morpeth?

We are tucked away on the first floor of Davison House within Sanderson Arcade in Morpeth. We are above Martino Lounge. Our location is ideal for brides as the studio is quiet, relaxed and private, meaning you can try the dresses on without anyone being able to see you.

ISITJUST A DRESS? Interview with Kate Atkinson owner of Bridal Reloved





"A wedding dress is one of the most exciting items of clothing that you get to wear. The shopping experience is like no other. The fitting process where you feel cared for and elite because you are literally stood on a pedestal having this garment fitted to you" - Kate Atkinson







o your found your one, your best friend, your soulmate, that person that makes you laugh out loud and be completely your own person. You're madly in love and your proposal was perfectbut there is still one more 'the one' to find . Confused? let me explain. I hear time and time again, this is the one, you step into the one and you just know, this is the one for you; you have found your perfect dress! When you know you know and this is so true with the wedding dress experience. Love is special, being a bride is special and this wedding dress is special but the question iswhy is a wedding dress so special? Its just material after all! Kate owner of Bridal Reloved spills all her industry knowledge in this fascinating article.



So, is it just a dress?

Kate: No, it's your wedding dress and could also be your bags for life, your cushion covers, your white blouse, a white summer dress, a night gown, a christening gown, your bed spread, a woven wall hanging or a rag rug. Dye it, deconstruct it and if you don't have the skills, ask your bridal seamstress to help.

If you sell it, that's funds that can go towards a honeymoon or an anniversary weekend away.

What goes into making a wedding dress?

Kate: A wedding dress takes 10,000-20,000 litres of water to make plus 10-20 kilograms of carbon emissions. They often have between 5-15 meters of fabric used... that's the length of a bus! Add a few more layers for structure and volume and that's a couple of buses. All this for an item that has just one purpose in life, to make it down the aisle.

So when we consciously take away the romance of this special dress, we can see that it comes with a greater cost than just the price tag.

What can you do with your dress to make sure it has a longer life span?

Kate: Sell it and give the garment longevity. Make something out of it, all that wonderful fabric that you paid for.

If you don't, your dress will end up in landfill where 1000s of wedding dresses go each year. And not just worn wedding dresses. Many designers around the world actually pay to send their surplus, discontinued and sample stock to a hole in the ground where it's going to take about 200 years to biodegrade, releasing many harmful greenhouse gasses along the way.

Tell us more about the wedding dress journey and why its so important to you?

Kate: Over our time in the industry we have seen so many great garments made. We want you to embrace your own path. Whether that's choosing a pre-loved, ex-sample or surplus gown. We want you to up-cycle the dress with your seamstress and make it your own by adding the sleeves you want or having a belt or a shorter train.

It's this evolution of gown to bride, and bride to boutique and our message that it's not just a dress that has rocketed our brand.

The demand for quality, service and a bespoke/add on/up-cycle is higher than ever. Brides, like you, are becoming more conscious of the impact of fast fashion and we are here for that.

So let's go back to the beginning is it just a dress?

We hope you agree that it definitely isn't and that your dress impacts on how you feel on your wedding day. We want you to feel the best version of yourself for yourself and perhaps your partner waiting to say "I do". Your dress will frame the memories of one of your best days. It has to be the most spectacular dress you have ever worn and don't be afraid to wear it again or repurpose your dress.

I'm super excited to interview Phiney the designer, maker and business woman behind Poppy Perspective.

Take us back to start of Poppy Perspective?

Phiney: I was born and raised in London but followed my dream of living by the sea a few years ago to set up my own buisness and start a family on the beautiful Kent coast.

Did you study fashion?

Phiney: Yes I originally studied womenswear at London College of Fashion and over the years have gone on to work across all areas of the industry from design and manufacturing to styling and photography.

Why Bridal Fashion?

Phiney: I have always had a love of vintage and antique textiles and most recently worked in restoration but something kept pulling me back to bridal.

Why the name Poppy Perspective?

Phiney: Poppy Perspective is named after a dear loved one, the name was born when a friend asked me to make her a bespoke wedding dress and has grown from there.

What are you passionate about?

Phiney: Sustainability !!! Especially within the fashion and wedding industries. I now mainly focus on my vintage range creating one of a kind dresses.



Tell us more about Poppy Perspective?

Phiney: Poppy Perspective is not your average bridal boutique (which is why we love you by the way). We are a very small team with a focus on sustainability and we create unique and unusual wedding dresses with a relaxed boho vibe.

What is your aim for brides?

Phiney: Our aim is to make women feel gorgeous and confident on their wedding day and to have special memories to hold onto long beyond.

How many collections do you have?

Phiney: We have Four collections. Our Vintage Collection, our Made to Order Collection . our Mini Collection and our **Bespoke** collection.

Tell us about your vintage collection first as this is very close to my heart!

Phiney: Our vintage dresses are a series of one off dresses made in reclaimed vintage laces, fabrics and trims. At the core of my ethos is to reuse. reduce and recycle and I love this range to offer my brides a sustainable dress option for their wedding day, with a dreamy boho vibe.

Why should brides choose vintage?

Phiney: Each dress is so special and I love that they all have their own stories and a history before I even start working on them. The range is always changing as I create and replace sold pieces with something new.

What price range can we expect to pay for one of your vintage dresses? Phiney: dresses are priced between £695 and £1495.

Tell us how your made to order collection works?

Phiney: My first collection of dresses and separates, named after the brides that inspired the designs and some dear loved ones.

This collection brings together favourite elements of my creations from over the years, is fully customisable and made to measure.

Tell us about your Bespoke option:

Phiney: The bespoke option is for the bride who wants a totally unique and one of a kind dress. I work closely with you throughout the design process and together we create luxurious pieces that are all about you and all lovingly handmade in my Kent studio. I love the fun of building your dream dress from scratch and although I now also offer options from 2 collections bespoke design is where I started. I love the journey we go on in the build up to your wedding and you will be involved at every stage from choosing fabrics to finishing details. I am happy to call many of my past brides friends.

What price range can we expect to pay for your Made to order collection?

Phiney: Made to order dresses start from £1750, separates start at £295.







Tell us all about your Mini collection?

Phiney: Sustainable and ethical occasion dresses for your little ones, currently available in ages 1 to 5. I'm always looking to reduce my waste and this range of flower girl dresses are handmade from off cuts and leftover fabrics, creating mini versions of the most popular dresses from my main collection. Vintage lace dresses to match your bridal gown are also available to order, as well as dresses to match any bespoke design.





What price range can we expect to pay for a dress from your Mini Collection?

Phiney: Prices start in this collection from £75.



What price range can we expect to pay for a completely bespoke wedding dress? Phiney: Bespoke dresses start at £2250.





To add to this vision the bridal party arrived in a classic black cab as a nod to the couples time spent in London . How perefct! The day was captured by Sheri Mcmahon photography and the beautiful bride wore a Savin London gown brought from Bridal Reloved Wanstead which strongly inspired the entire look of the day alongside her love for an outdoor wedding.





















How did your Simon propose?

Rhianne: We were living as Australian expats in London during the pandemic and Simon took the opportunity to take me to Paris for our anniversary. He used that as an excuse to hide his preparing anything out the ordinary in the lead up. Simon took me for a walk around springtime Paris. We sat in The Tuileries, and he proposed. We then sipped on champagne, ate good cheese and macaroons. The beautiful sights, tastes and sounds made it even more memorable.

When and where was your Wedding?

Rhianne: We got married on 4 November 2023, Vaucluse House, Sydney.

Why did you choose your Wedding Venue?

Rhianne: We chose the venue for its beautiful, historic gardens. November is late spring in Sydney; the weather is warm but not too hot to be outside during the day, the flowers are out and it's light late into the evening.

How did you decide on your colour scheme?

Rhianne: I chose brighter colours based on the weather and because brights make me feel happy and like it's a party. I loved the idea of tonal pink for my bridesmaids so that it didn't look too uniform- like and so that they could choose a shade of pink and style of dress that they felt comfortable in. Additionally, since they lived in both Australia and the United States, there would be no group try-ons before the wedding day, so mismatched would be ideal when not having dresses custom made. Happily, it worked out well! Simon chose the white linen and green for himself and his groomsmen. He found the jacket and felt comfortable and stylish.

Do you have help with Planning or Styling?

Rhianne: I chose to do the planning and styling myself - I loved the opportunity to be creative! I work as an Associate Producer, so schedules, budgets and sourcing vendors is familiar. I picked the menus, napkins and the colour palette via research on Etsy, Pinterest and Instagram over

about 6 months. (Simon and I can attest to many nights of cutting circular menus with a cricut machine or making vinyl decals for mirrored seating charts in the lead up!) On the day, I had friends that were guests put out the place settings based on a design that I'd sent them (again, thank you Instagram).

I sent images of my dress (a lot of the aesthetic was based around the Savin London dress from Bridal Reloved Wanstead!), a colour palette, the bridesmaid dresses and outdoor weddings in France /Italy to the florist for inspiration. From there, Susan Avery and her team made the magic happen. Their knowledge, experience and guidance brought it altogether. The flowers that they delivered were above and beyond what I could have dreamed. Simply stunning and made the wedding.

How did you choose your Photographer?

Rhianne: We spoke with a few photographers; however we'd found that a lot were using darker colour presets on their images. As I'd planned to have bright florals, we wanted someone that could capture the true colour. I stumbled upon Sheri's socials, and we found her images refreshingly light, bright and airy. We spoke with Sheri, found her thoughtful and excited.

On the day, she was fantastic. She brought skill, did copious amounts of preparation, she was courteousness to guests and managed to get photos without being intrusive. (The latter was a big thing for us, we'd been to two friend's weddings recently where the photographers interrupted key moments which seemed a shame).

How did you bring the fun to your Wedding Day?

Rhianne: Simon and I invited approx. 70 guests, so we could speak with everyone. We kept it intimate, romantic and laid back - we wanted the guests to enjoy themselves! Seeing everyone enjoying the food, company and dancing was amazing.

Describe your Big Day?

Rhianne: Simon was in a hotel in the city with his groomsmen getting ready and I was at home with my bridesmaids. I only found out later that his uber couldn't get through to his hotel due to a large scale protest, so he and his groomsmen ran to a train station a few blocks away, took a train as far as they could, then ubered the rest of the way to get there on time. From the photos, the boys had the time of their lives! Meanwhile, my Maid of Honour and bestie Lis, who I've known since I was 16, flew out from Texas and had stayed over at my place to keep me company the night before (there was a 10pm excited moment / midnight snack before we finally fell asleep!)

After coffee and cake for breakfast (important), the other bridesmaids arrived and hair and make up artists Sophia and Juliana came to do our hair etc. We were all just calm and listening to music. Apparently, this seemed odd to the make up ladies! I knew in events things happen regardless of all the planning in the world, but it works out, so I was happy to enjoy the moment with my friends! We almost had rain stop our outdoor ceremony but my bridesmaid Tracie, a Producer, told the venue to hold out - her call was right! The cars arrived (1960s London cabs) and took us to the venue.

The ceremony was on a lawn in front of the historic Vaucluse House. Friends and family that we'd not been able to see for years were all there and it made it tremendously special. Our celebrant, Lucy Taylor, is light-hearted and fun. She was great in bringing an energy of love, happiness, and excitement. Both Simon and I wanted the ceremony to be meaningful, but not without moments of laughter. We laugh a lot as a couple, to have a solemn mass would not be us.

The Reception flew by. A key moment was our dance that Simon had encouraged us to learn. It was fun to do something different together as a couple. (I actually had to source a seconddress, also recycled fashion, a few weeks before as Simon didn't know that there is no option to dance behind the train of the Savin dress, even with a hook for a bustle!)

Our dance opened up the dancefloor, which other than food, was an important part of the night to us!

Who was the designer of your Wedding dress?

Rhianne: Savin London designed my dream wedding dress. I'd returned to London for a visit since moving back to Sydney in the hopes that I could find something similar to their designs. We'd booked the venue and I knew they often had dresses with bright floral appliques. I googled and found Bridal Reloved Wanstead had several Savin London gowns to try. I'd never dreamed that I'd be able to have an actual Savin dress! (And carry it all the way through a 3-hour line at Heathrow, through Hong Kong airport and into Sydney).

Was it important to eb an Eco Bride? / Why did you choose Bridal Reloved?

Rhianne: I tried four wedding shops in London - both new and recycled stock. During the process I found that the variation in stock was much more exciting in the two shops where they sold samples /recycled wedding dresses. sure that it's what I wanted. Whilst it wasn't the original focus, I love the idea of being an Eco Bride, in fact a lot of items I purchased for the styling, not only my dress, were pre-loved. There is so much waste for one day, the idea to reuse something and pass it onto the next bride for good luck seemed wonderful.

Who walked you down the aisle?

Rhianne: My Dad, Rod, walked me down the aisle. It was nice to have a special memory for iust him and I.

What was your first dance?

Rhianne: Unchained Melody by the Righteous Brothers.

What food and drink did you have?

Rhianne: Half of our guests either had allergies or were vegetarian / vegans, so we chose share platters where there were several items available for every dietary requirement. The standout items for Simon and I were:

- BARRAMUNDI WITH TOASTED COCONUT AND WILD GINGER (V, GF)
- SLOW ROASTED LAMB SHOULDER WITH FENNEL. ROSEMARY AND RED WINE JUS (GF, DF)

Would you have done the day differently? Is there anything you would have changed?

We both loved the wedding, and it was better than we'd ever imagined. We wouldn't change anything. ⊚

Who caught your bouquet?

Rhianne: I didn't have a bouquet toss as I wasn't too keen on this tradition. However, there were plenty of flowers for guests to take home afterwards to enjoy (and cake to put under their pillow if they were superstitious!)

Is there a special someone in your life right now? Are you married?



Hello beautiful brides to be; its Mel owner of Bridal Reloved Leicester. With 6 years in the Wedding Industry I can honestly say I love hearing the speeches at a Wedding; it's my favourite part of Wedding talk in my boutique too except all the dreamy dresses of course!

After seeing the bride in her dress the speeches come a close second of great anticipation for all the guests to enjoy so today I'm going to talk to you lovely lot about wedding speeches and how to deliver a memorable toast. My top tips for toasting a truly unforgettable speech that will leave a lasting impression on the newlyweds and their guests!



eddings are a time of joy, celebration, and love, and one of the highlights of any wedding reception is the speeches and toasts. Whether you're the best man, maid of

honour, a close friend, or a family member, delivering a memorable wedding toast is a wonderful opportunity to express your love and well wishes for the happy couple. 












INTERVIEW WITH ECO BRIDE LUCY


Who caught your bouquet?
















FIRST LOOK WITH LOTUS



I absolutely love First Looks! So much so that I'm writing this article but what on earth are they?! Simply put, it's the first time the couple see each other in their gorgeous wedding attire looking absolutely stunning on their wedding day. A moment of falling in love all over again.



ormally this happens at the ceremony, but what if you were to switch things up and do it privately, just the two of you (and your photographer) before the ceremony? Yep, I heard you gasp, BEFORE the ceremony?!?!?

That's right. First Looks aren't a new thing, they've been popular in America for a long time, but in England, they seem to be taking a while to catch on.

Here are a few reasons I think it's worth thinking about having a First Look:

Timing: Let's start with a practical reason. If your ceremony isn't until later in the day, it might already be dark by the point you actually have time for your couple's photos, or you might have to rush them between the meal, the cake cutting, the dancing, and celebrating your wedding day. Doing them earlier means you can free up more of your day leaving more time to celebrate, whilst sneakily creating a quiet moment for just the two of you.

Take it all in:

You've spent a long time adding all those beautiful unique details to your wedding attire, this gives you a chance to take it all in.











Calm The Nerves

If you're nervous, a hug from someone you love can put the world to right. I once shot a First Look where the couple were both really nervous, but instantly felt better and relaxed after seeing each. We even set it up so that after the photos, I was shooed away so they could have a private cup of tea and a biscuit, just the two of them, before the ceremony.

Photos

Of course you'll still get those beautiful photos of your faces as you walk toward each other during the ceremony, but a First Look gives you so many more chances to get even more photos. You can even switch things up and do all your couple's photos before the ceremony, giving you even more free time to celebrate later.

The Other Side Of The Coin

Now I could leave it with just the positives and amazing arguments for a First Look, however, you all know I'm far too honest, so here are some of the realities and considerations:

Technically It's Not Just The Two Of You I'm only 5ft4, but that's still tall enough to be noticed, especially when I'm holding my camera. Yes, we all love to talk about the privacy and intimacy of a First Look, but your Photographer and Videographer will still be there. We promise to be discrete, to give you this moment, but the truth is we're still there.

Lighting

Certain times of day do not produce the most flattering light for photos. For example, go outside and take a selfie at noon and then take another one at sunset, spot the difference? Lighting is something photographers study for a long time, we know how to make it work, but the truth is that some light is harsh, so sometimes it worth waiting until later to get that beautiful light.

Playing It Cool

I blame Hollywood for this, but there is a huge expectation about partners having a BIG

reaction to seeing each other. The truth is that some people always look calm and collected on the outside.

You can truly appreciate how beautiful you each look, absorb all the little touches right down to the jewellery and crazy socks.

whilst on the inside they are overflowing with emotion. If your partner is like this, set your expectations, don't assume a First Look will get you that BIG Hollywood reaction.

Location Location
























ECO BRIDE GABRIELLA

How did Dan Propose?

Gabriella: I had absolutely no idea it was coming! He booked a romantic weekend away for my birthday, which was all a surprise.

We had gone for a long walk in the morning, and we were heading to Hintlesham Hall for afternoon tea. Before going in we took a walk around the gardens, and next thing he's down on one knee. He gave a lovely speech about our relationship, and we were both very excited to tell everyone.

He booked the suite, afternoon tea and a spa – followed by Japanese food and cocktails.

When and where was your Wedding?

Gabriella: We got married on July 8th 2023, at Bateman's Barn in Norfolk.

Why did you choose your Wedding Venue?

Gabriella: It was really important to Dan and I that the venue was as eco-conscious as possible. I work for a conservation charity, and we also own our own refill business.

Bateman's Barn was the top venue close to us in Cambridge when we searched for 'green wedding venues'. After the first meeting we spent the entire time talking to the owners, Nicole and John, about wetland restoration and bird spotting so we knew it was the place for us. The outside space was exactly what we were looking for when it came to the ceremony and the grounds and moat were an added bonus for pictures. I can't recommend them highly enough!

How did you decide on your Colour scheme?

Gabriella: We didn't really have a colour scheme! Our flowers were foraged from the venue's regenerative farm, and as we didn't know which flowers we would be getting on the day we kept the rest of it fairly neutral. We wanted to make sure that my dress and bouquet, and Dan's suit wouldn't clash with the colours of the wild flowers. As we didn't have

groomsmen or bridesmaids, it made keeping everything neutral a lot easier.

Did you have help with planning our styling?

Gabriella: Nicole at Bateman's Barn was brilliant, she was out at the crack of dawn foraging for us and also made the grounds look stunning on the day. The rest of the styling was down to whatever we could get our hands on secondhand or upcycled ourselves.

We are very lucky to have great friends who leant us flower vases, picture-frames and other items for the day. We upcycled our seating chart from a pre-loved pallet, and we made signs for our garden games from scrap wood. It was very rustic, but we absolutely loved the finish on the day.

How did you choose your Photographer?

Gabriella: Kezia was recommended to us by the venue, and we are so glad to have met her. From the first coffee meeting we instantly clicked. She was fabulous on the day and made the photography seamless, she really captured the best parts of our day and we're grateful to have such wonderful photos to look back on.

Describe your big day

Gabriella: I N C R E D I B L E . We had a very stressful week in the lead-up with our car breaking down (with Dan in it!) late the night before and my mum having food poisoning. But when the day itself came, it was perfect. From getting ready to the final dance, we were on cloud nine. Our friends and family were so wonderful and made the day very special. We really wanted it to be a relaxed, garden games and BBQ feel, and it was just that. A lot of our photos are Dan and I wondering around fields, beer in hand,

just laughing with one another or with friends. There was no pressure, no rushing or stress, it was just an all-round fun day. We didn't want it to end.

How did you bring the fun to your wedding day?

Gabriella: We had garden games throughout the day, so everyone could grab a drink and play cricket, Finska/Molky, ring toss (made from wine bottles) or corn hole – which Dan's parents very kindly made for us from their old flooring.

We both gave a speech which was fun, and we had a big group first dance after the BBQ. Dan and I also made our own playlist for the DJ so it felt like it really was catered to us and our personality.

Who was the designer of your wedding dress? Gabriella: Watters

Was it important to be an Eco Bride? / Why did you choose Bridal Reloved?



Why a Toastmaster is a Must-Have for Your Wedding Day

f you like the idea of having someone to formally guide, announce, and help support your day - a wedding toastmaster could be for you. In this article Stefan also known as 'The Tall Toastmaster,' gives us an insiders view on being a toastmaster and what he can • offer all you lovely brides.

Your wedding day is a once-in-a-lifetime event, filled with joy, excitement, and love. However, with so many moving parts and potential hiccups, it can be easy for stress to take over and detract from your special day. This is where a professional toastmaster can make all the difference. Over to you Stefan!!

Stefan: Hi , yes I'm Stefan and toastmasters are experts in the art of event coordination, helping to ensure that everything runs smoothly and that your day is as magical as you've always hoped it would be.

Take us right back to the beginning of The Tall Toastmaster? Describe your career?





Stefan: I began my career in the hotel industry over two decade's ago as a Wedding Coordinator and Conference and Banqueting Manager. Whilst running hundreds of events and weddings over the years I realized that what I really wanted was to be a professional Toastmaster. The most enjoyable part of my job has always been meeting people, getting to know what they want out of their event, and helping them to achieve this.

How many years have you been in the Wedding Industry?

Stefan: I've worked in the industry for 20 years being a professional Toastmaster for 11 years.

How many weddings have you been part of?

Stefan: Roughly 1200 weddings I've been involved in which is such a privilage when I really think about it .The joy in knowing you have helped someone achieved their perfect day is just priceless.

How tall are you?

Stefan: 6ft 7

What's the strangest request your EVER had at a Wedding?

Stefan: I assisted the best man to get undressed so he could do his speech in his underpants!!

THE TALL TOASTMASTER



Where is your favourite wedding venue?

Stefan: I've always said it's not the venue it's the people attending the day that make it special. If I had to choose, I would say Grantley Hall @grantleyhall_

How did you bring the FUN to a Wedding?

Stefan: I'm a big believer to make people feel like there at home and comfortable in the surroundings, which makes them relax and have fun. I make sure that everything is under control so people can enjoy themselves.

What is your main role at a wedding?

Stefan: My main role is to look after my couple and their guests whist making sure the venue and suppliers are all on the same side to make the couples day go without a hitch, and make sure they have the wedding that they have dreamt of.

What time do you usually arrive at the wedding venue?

Stefan: 2 hours before.

Describe your personality in three words? Stefan: Fun/Professional/Calming



Why should you consider hiring a toastmaster for vour wedding?

Stefan: From the dress and venue to the catering and music, every detail needs to be just right. There are so many moving parts on the day and people to coordinate, things could become overwhelming. This is where a professional toastmaster comes in. A toastmaster is a master of ceremonies, trained to manage and coordinate events like weddings.

A toastmaster is a fabulous way of adding an extra sense of occasion to the day. While maintaining an unobtrusive presence throughout, good toastmasters give the wedding party and their guests the feeling that they are being looked after and that the event is under control.

There are so many reasons why a toastmaster is a great addition to your big day. Ive actually provided a list:

No. 1 perhaps the most important reason is keeping the wedding on schedule. A toastmaster ensures that everything runs according to plan and that the day stays on schedule and keeps things running smoothly. They act as a liaison between you, your suppliers and your guests, ensuring that everyone knows what's happening and when. They can help keep your timeline on track and ensure that everyone is in the right place at the right time for photographs,

speeches and more... ensuring that the whole day keeps to schedule and nobody's missing from the all important group shots.

No.2 Reduces stress - A toastmaster takes on the responsibility of coordinating with vendors, making announcements, and ensuring that everything is running smoothly. This takes a lot of pressure off of the bride and groom and their families and can help you stay relaxed throughout the day. With so much to do and so many people to manage, a toastmaster can help alleviate some of that stress by taking care of the details for you. They can handle any unexpected delays that arise and ensure that they are on hand for any questions from the venue staff or other suppliers on the day, in essence they make sure that everything is taken care of so that you can relax and enjoy your day.

No.3 Professionalism - A toastmaster adds a touch of elegance and professionalism to your wedding. They dress in formal attire and act as the ultimate host for your event and what's more special than being introduced as a newly married couple in such a traditional and special way creating a memorable experience for you and your guests.

No.3 Experience - A toastmaster has experience in coordinating weddings and events. They know how to handle any situation that may arise, from a late vendor to a missing wedding party member.



No. 4 **Personal touch** - A toastmaster can add a personal touch to your wedding by announcing special moments, such as a touching speech or a surprise gift. A good toastmaster knows how to keep your guests engaged and entertained. They can introduce speakers, make announcements, and even add a touch of humour to your reception. This can help keep your guests happy and engaged and really felt taken care of throughout the whole event.

How do you pic the right toastmaster for you?

Stefan: Character counts so much . I would always choose a toastmaster who you feel that really gets. They need to get on well with your guests and oversee events of the day in a charismatic, yet unobtrusive manner. After all, your wedding is an occasion for celebration - you want everyone to feel comfortable and looked after by the toastmaster you choose.

If you haven't been recommended a toastmaster by a friend or associate, an online search will quickly produce a list of names, such as the Guild of Professional Toastmasters, The London Guild of Toastmasters, The UK School of Professional Toastmasters, The Institute of Toastmasters of Great Britain, and The English Toastmasters Association.

What is your general timetable for the day? Lets start with your arrival to Venue?

Stefan: I arrive at the venue in plenty of time so I can build a nice rapport with the hotel staff and make sure I have a good understanding of how they work. I ask if they need any help with anything before it all starts and I go through timings for the day with the person in charge., I introduce myself to and offer any help to the photographer/videographer if they haven't been to the venue before and plan what they later in the day. I know which rooms are being used for which part of the day.

What is your role at the Civil Ceremony?

Stefan: I introduce myself to the registrars when they arrive and ask them what they would like me to do during the ceremony. Introduce the groom/bride and their best man to the registrars and confirm when they would like to talk to them before it all starts. I introduce myself to the ushers and see if they need any help with buttonholes, ties, or hankies! (This happens a lot!) Go through the seating plan with the ushers and also indicate what their role will be for the day.



How do you help with the Arrival Drinks?

Stefan: I arrange the arrival drinks for the happy couple after the ceremony. I make sure I know where to guide the guests to for the arrival drinks and also for the photographer. I assist the photographer with the group shots and, if required, I announce the confetti shot/bouquet throw or large group shot. I arrange with the venue for the couple to have their own canapé plate if canapés have been ordered. I always make sure they have a drink if they would like one. I answer any questions that the guests have.

What is your role at the Wedding Breakfast?

Stefan: First, I ask the couple if they would like to see the room before everyone goes in. When the room is ready, I will call them in and arrange the receiving line if they are having one. I will organize any music being played when they enter the room. Once the wedding party are seated the speeches will be introduced, unless there are after-dinner speeches. I will say 'Grace' if this is required. I inform the guests about the bell for the bride/groom, so they know what it's for. The bell is there in case the couple needs to speak to me at any point, or just wants a top-up! It's just a bit of fun and the guests seem to like it. I will arrange the cutting of the cake.

How do you help with the Speeches?

Stefan: Just before I introduce the speeches I will check if they have any presents to hand out. When they are ready to start speeches it's always a good idea to inform the guests five minutes before to make sure everyone is aware when they are going to start. I always check with the venue that they have a microphone to use and see if the videographer needs to set up their microphone and speakers before we start! Sometimes they need to change the lapel microphone for each speaker, so I check first. Before we start, I always make sure the order of speakers and if they would want to use a microphone? Depending on numbers I always guide them if they need to use it or not.

For each speaker, I would introduce them before they start and get the guests to make some noise to cheer them on. At the end of the speeches, I would make it clear what's going to happen next and inform them where to go.

What is your role at the evening reception?

Stefan: Once the meal and speeches have finished, I will call all the guests out of the room to the bar area. At this point sometimes the photographer takes the Couple out for more pictures so it's just making sure they are happy, and I will then check with the venue if they need any help on turning the room around for evening celebrations. Once the main room is ready, I make sure that the suppliers that are attending are in the right spot before I call guests back in and to make sure that the Couple are not near the main door just in case, they accidentally start a receiving line which could take a long time with the extra guests in the evening! If they haven't cut the cake in the daytime, I organize this to happen just before the first dance. I make sure they are in the right spot at the right time before the DJ announces them both and guide them out to cut the cake and lead them to do the first dance!



Why should our brides book you?

Stefan: My Couples can ensure that their day will go as planned and will be one to remember.

"We were advised to have a toastmaster on our big day and without a doubt that was brilliant advice that we will now continue to share. When looking for your ideal toastmaster I fail to see how you could do better than the Tall Toastmaster. He visited us a few days before our wedding and within minutes we both felt a warming reassurance that there was a suave professional with the elegance, expertise, and presence to make sure the day flows as planned. Lots of things happened on the day but the toastmaster was ever-present guiding the groomsmen, supporting the bridesmaids, facilitating for the cameraman, co-ordinating times with the venue, making sure we had a drink and were served canapes, etc., and all this behind the scenes whilst the front of house smartly bringing a commanding sophistication to proceedings; Making sure guests knew what was happening and where they needed to be and when they needed to be there. Do not get married without a toastmaster and if the tall toastmaster is available do not get married without him!!!

HANDFASTING CORDS

A

handfasting cord (sometimes known as a handbinding cord or simply a wedding cord) is a cord or ribbon which is used for literally 'tying the knot' during a wedding or betrothal ceremony. The couple stand together and the handfasting cord is wrapped or tied around their joined hands, representing the joining of their lives and the binding of their union. Through this ritual, the couple display their unity and become bound to one another. In this article Laura tells us what we need to know about handfasting and if its right for you on your wedding day!



A SIMPLE GUIDE TO HANDFASTING

hen it comes to planning your wedding ceremony, you may be interested in having a Celebrant instead of a registrar. There are big differences between the two, the most obvious being content and time length. Celebrants offer more flexibility and essentially create your ceremony with careful guidance from you. We understand that every couple is different and so there will be different things you may wish to include, one of which is a symbolic ritual.

So what is a ritual?

Rituals are elements that are included in wedding ceremonies symbolise your union as a couple /

family / blended family. They are a beautiful keepsake for you to treasure and remind you of your special day. I usually recommend to my couples to include no more than 2 or 3 rituals, depending on the length they would like the ceremony to be. The most popular option is for a handfasting or handtying, after personal vows.

Handfasting vs Handtving

Handfasting or handtying becomes more popular each wedding season. There are different ways of doing both with a Handfasting typically being more spiritual as the Celebrant will call upon the elements and likely have an alter to

accompany and support the ritual. Handfasting is of Celtic origin and people would often be handfasted with fabric strips made into a Handfasting chord instead of exchanging gold rings, which was reserved for royalty and wealth. Handtying is adapted from this and you can discuss with your

celebrant which way of tying and knotting suits you best.

You can choose fabrics, ribbons, charms and photo lockets to decorate and create your braid, or you can have







key guests drape ribbons over your hands. Some brides choose fabric from family member's wedding dresses or veils. You can also choose to have a blessing piece shared as your hands are tied together.

Extended from this a very simple tying of the knot which is a simple to communicate your nuptials in photographs. Typically this is done after your vows and you can kiss and showcase your knot at the same time!

During a handtying or a simple tying of the knot, you may wish to provide your guests with shots as you do indeed, tie the knot which always goes down well and is a great way to include them within your ceremony.

What's more, as they say "a wet knot is harder to untie" meaning rain on your wedding day is actually lucky. If you are looking to include a handfasting or a handtying within your ceremony content and the venue allows, your Celebrant can bless your chord or ribbons with water to symbolise this.





We had an incredible open day (minus the changing room falling down 20 minutes before we opened the doors! Thank goodness for builders Joe and Ian!) We had live music from Graham of G Mans Blues. It was a great turnout and we met some lovely couples and amazing local suppliers.

What would be your dream styled shoot?

Lucy: I would absolutely LOVE to do a styled shoot at Wild Waterfall in Bali. It is a stunning secluded waterfall beneath a mountain, such a gorgeous and intimate place and a unique venue. I keep trying to convince my husband to renew our vows here (no luck so far!). With an amazing florist and photographer and some creative suppliers this would make for an out of this

world styled photoshoot (and a great excuse to go to Bali!)

Who is your ideal bride?

Lucy: I think any bride is an ideal bride, we cater for everyone with a huge range of dresses. We sell off the peg dresses so it doesn't matter if your wedding is in 18 months or 3 as long as you give your seamstress some time! Each appointment is so different but they are all just as special. 

INTERVIEW WITH ECO BRIDE PIPPA

How did Michael propose?

Pippa: Michael proposed at De Vere Tortworth Court Hotel, near Bristol, and it was a total surprise. We booked the trip as a relatively last minute getaway to enjoy some country views and relaxation after an especially stressful work period for us both, and Michael decided to make the trip even more special by proposing! We had a gorgeous three course meal in the restaurant and decided to take our drinks outside to enjoy the summer evening air and after a short while walking around the grounds appreciating the flower beds (as avid gardeners), he delighted me with a speech about how much he loves me. Before I knew it, he was down on one knee and made me the happiest woman alive.

When and where was your wedding?

Pippa: Our wedding was at Le Manoir Du Bout Du Pont, in France, on the 3rd June 2023.

Why did you choose your Wedding venue?

Pippa: Rather embarrassing to admit, but we didn't actually go and see the wedding venue until a few months beforehand. However, we started looking at wedding venues near us not long after getting engaged and we both felt they didn't feel very 'us'.

We both love travelling to France, and our favourite thing to do is roadtrips to explore beautiful places. We found Ala on instagram and moments after I started to look at some of her images, I reached out. With luck, she was available, and thank goodness she was as her images were perfection.

Describe your Big Day?

Pippa: Our wedding day was MAGICAL! It's the word that always springs to mind whenever anyone asks us how our wedding was.

We were surrounded by our absolute favourite people, who had all made such an effort to be there to celebrate our love, and we felt really blessed to get to experience such a big moment in our lives with all of them there.

A wedding is just a day, but a marriage is a lifetime, and that's what really matters!











































